

Minister of Switzerland in Tokyo between 1940 and 1945, Camille Gorgé was a privileged witness of this dramatic period of world history. His unpublished memoirs, of more than 500 pages, entitled Defeat in Rising Sun: Diary of a Witness, were written in the years following the end of the war. This narrative was carefully constructed on the basis of Gorgé's memory, his personal notes, and official reports and correspondence. Gorgé was the neutral representative of numerous countries in war against Japan. He took notes regarding his daily diplomatic work and the evolution of war, including both facts and his own thoughts about Japanese society, politics, and military dictatorship. A team of historians led by professors Claude Hauser and Pierre-Yves Donzé prepared a thematic and critical edition of this document, which has been released in French in July 2018 with the support of UniDistance, the Swiss Distance Learning University. An electronic version is under preparation. This unique document offers a fresh and new perspective on daily life of foreigners and diplomatic work in Japan during World War II.


Prof. Claude Hauser

Claude Hauser is Professor for Contemporary History at the University of Fribourg (Switzerland). He is also Dean of the Faculty of Historical Sciences at UniDistance, the Swiss Distance Learning University. His research topics are: Intellectual history and international cultural relations, especially in the French-speaking areas. Since 2018 he is President of the International Association of Quebec Studies. (AIEQ)

Prof. Pierre-Yves Donzé

Pierre-Yves Donzé is a professor of business history at Osaka University and a visiting professor at the University of Fribourg. His research focuses on the global history of firms and industries, in particular watchmaking, fashion and medtech. He is a member of the councils of the European Business History Association and the Business History Society of Japan.
